<u>4.</u> It was discussed that parliamentary questions would be framed around the issues of assisted suicide and the end of life choices lecture.

Dorothy Grace Elder suggested a number of possible questions that could be addressed

"What steps have been taken regarding the GRIPS report on chronic pain in general?"

"Have the report actions been implemented since it was published in 2007?"

The main issues identified were of the need to be precise in the phrasing of the questions addressing the inequality in pain services.

As highlighted by <u>Prof Marie Fallon</u>, there is an issue of the availability, integration of services and the sustainability of the delivery. <u>Dorothy Grace Elder</u> suggested that we are guided by <u>Prof. Marie Fallon</u> and <u>Dr. Lesley Colvin</u>
